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## Partons en vacances!

Follow the instructions below to create a fun study aid. This aid will help you review the grammar on pages 352 , 362 , and 364 of your textbook.

MATERIALS You will need some sheets of paper and a pen or pencil.

STEP 1 Fold a sheet of paper in thirds from top to bottom, then in half from top to bottom. Open the sheet. It should have six rows.


STEP 2 Fold the sheet in half from side to side, then fold it in half again. Open the sheet. You now have six rows and four columns.

STEP 3 You're going to label the first row with an -er infinitive such as parler at the very top center and just below it, singular forms. Still in the first row, but at the bottom crease, label each of the four columns: conditionnel, passé composé, imparfait, subjontif.


Write each of the three singular conjugated verb forms in the second, fourth, and sixth rows.

STEP 4 Turn the paper face down. At the very top of the first row, write the same -er infinitive again and below it, plural forms. Then, label the four columns. Write each of the three singular conjugated verb forms in the second, fourth, and sixth rows.


STEP 5 When you have finished writing the forms of the verb, follow the creases to refold the sheet in fan or accordion style so that the infinitive is facing up. Fold and label two more sheets, one for an -ir verb such as venir and the other for an -re verb like boire.

STEP 6 Review the chapter grammar concepts by reading the infinitives and giving the conjugated forms. Open the pleats one by one to check your answers.
