#### **FOLD-N-LEARN PROJECT SUGGESTIONS**


Follow the instructions below to create a fun study aid. This aid will help you review the grammar on pages 58 and 60 of your textbook.

**MATERIALS** You will need paper and a pen or pencil.

**STEP 1** Fold a sheet of paper in thirds from top to bottom. Open the sheet and fold it in thirds from side to side.




**STEP 2** Now unfold the sheet lengthwise. Trace all the creases with a pen or pencil. You should have nine rectangles.



**STEP 3** You're going to label the three rectangles in the left column. In the top one, write **Chapitre 2.** In the middle one, write *Conjugation*, and in the bottom one, *Uses*.

**STEP 4** On the top row, write **avoir** in the middle rectangle and **être** in the rectangle next to it. You should now have the top row labeled.



**STEP 5** Fill in the comparison chart by writing the conjugation of each verb in the **passé composé** in the middle row. In the bottom row, list the verbs on pages 58 and 60 with which each is used and include their past participle form. On the back, write five sentences with **avoir** and five with **être** in the **passé composé.** 

**STEP 6** Review the **passé composé** with **avoir** and with **être** using the comparison chart you've created.
